

MOVING CHECKLIST

AUTOMOTIVE RECORDS

- **Driver's License:** Update your driver's license to reflect your new address, typically within a specific timeframe set by your state's Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).
- Vehicle Registration: Update your vehicle's registration to your new address. This may also involve updating the title and obtaining new license plates, if necessary.
- Vehicle Insurance: Notify your auto insurance company of your change in address and make sure your policy accurately reflects your new location.

HOME RECORDS

- Home Insurance: If you're a homeowner, update your home insurance policy to reflect your new address. Renters should also update their renter's insurance.
- Utility Providers: Notify utility companies (water, electricity, gas, cable, internet) of your move and establish services at your new address.
- Subscriptions: Notify magazines, newspapers, and any other subscription or membership services of your address change.

HEALTH RECORDS

- Health Insurance: Update your health insurance provider with your new address, and ensure your coverage remains valid in your new area.
- Medical Records: Transfer your medical records to healthcare providers in your new area, including your primary care physician, specialists, and hospitals.
- Dental Records: Inform your dentist of your address change, and have your dental records transferred to a new provider if necessary.

PET RECORDS

- Veterinary Records: Update your pet's veterinary records if you're relocating to a new area, and find a local veterinarian.
- Pet Microchip Registration: If you have pets with microchips, update their registration information to your new address.

GOVERNMENTAL RECORDS

- Tax Records: Notify the Internal Revenue
 Service (IRS) and state tax authorities of your
 address change. Update your address with
 any tax preparation services you use.
- Legal Documents: Update legal documents, such as your will, living will, and power of attorney, to reflect your new address and circumstances.
- Post Office: Submit a change of address form with the U.S. Postal Service to forward mail from your old address to your new one.
- Social Security: Notify the Social Security Administration of your new address.
- Voter Registration: Update your voter registration to participate in local and national elections in your new state.
