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Steps for Moving to Florida During Hurricane Season

1. Know the Season, Not Just the Date

Hurricane season runs June through November, with August through October typically the busiest stretch. Most moves during this window arrive on schedule, knowing the season lets you plan for occasional weather delays rather than being caught off guard by them.

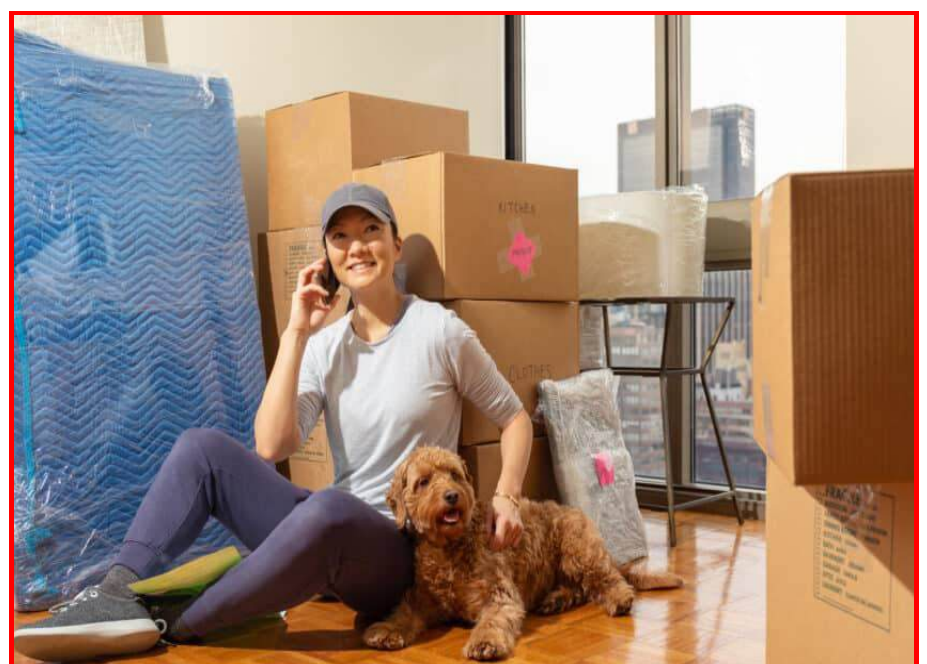


2. Build Flexibility Into Your Move Dates

A delivery window with breathing room is far less stressful than one tied to a single fixed day. Avoid scheduling move-in for the exact arrival date; a one-to-two-day buffer and a simple backup accommodation plan turn a potential delay into a minor inconvenience.

3. Stay in Close Contact With Your Mover

A good moving coordinator tracks the weather along your route and updates you before it becomes a problem. Before booking, ask who your point of contact is, how often you'll hear from them, and what the process looks like if a delivery date needs to change due to weather.



4. Prepare Your Florida Home for a Flexible Arrival

Confirm gate codes, parking arrangements, and building move-in policies with your new property ahead of time. Keep a separate essentials bag with medications, chargers, clothes, and important documents, and ask your mover about valuation coverage before items are loaded, not after.

5. Choose the Right Mover

The mover you choose has an outsized impact on a storm-season relocation. Compare communication style and route experience alongside price, you want a team that handles belongings carefully, keeps you informed throughout, and has managed hurricane season moves before.



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
